



#### Hello Parents!

It's been a great first full week of school! The students have been working hard and getting used to our daily routine.

**Homeroom Students:** 

Math - We've begun Unit 1 in math, working on place value and rounding this week.

Social Studies - We have read through the first, introduction chapter, "Discovering the Social Sciences", which discusses how different social scientists view the world (economist, geographer, historian, political scientist)

Afternoon Students (English Language Arts)

We started reading the story "Porpoises in Peril", worked on the difference between common and formal nouns, looked at pronouns (he, she, I, we, etc.), and how adding -ed or -ing to the end of a verb changes when something happened (jump, jumping, jumped).
