MS. BENDY'S MUSICAL NOTES...

Music has been off to a great start at Nelson Ridge. The students have been doing a wonderful job on their singing and playing of the Orff Instruments, as well as incorporating more technology in the music classroom!

In October, we will be working on learning to sing in rounds and being able to play 2 parts on the barred instruments using fall songs such as Spooky Night and Tocatta and Fugue.



ART NEWS FROM MRS. KORDIK

Fourth grade began the new school year using analogous colors of watercolor paint. The paintings were used to create a landscape of their choice. We looked at the artwork of artist Ali Hancock who creates prints of various northwestern landscapes. A variety of lines were added to the watercolor background to show textures and movement. In our next lesson, the students explored the concept of one point perspective to create building-like structures. We added zentangle style lines to the top of each shape and blended oil pastels on the sides. Through these lessons the students discovered that artists use a variety of lines to show many things such as texture, movement and space.

Fifth Grade students explored the concept of balance to create a radial style drawing inspired by a repeating leaf shape. The students added color to designs using crayon, colored pencil and marker. Then after viewing the transparent glass paintings of Janet Fish, they created their own symmetrical vase shapes to create an overlapping composition. The compositions were painted using the red, yellow, and blue watercolor paint. The secondary colors were created in the overlapping sections of the vases. After the painting dried, detail, highlights, and shadows were added with pencil, crayon, and white oil pastels.

Sixth grade viewed the surrealist eye paintings of Rene Magritte. Surrealism is an art style that is characterized by its dream-like quality. We drew an enlarged eye, discussing the various parts and proportions. We reviewed the color concepts as the student reviewed the proper technique of mixing intermediate colors with their watercolors. The color wheel was used as the iris to create a surrealistic style eye. Each student came up with a unique concept that they used to complete their drawing around the eye. They had their choice of media using crayons, colored pencils, markers or drawing pencils.

NEWS FROM YOUR LIBRARY "TEAM"

Nelson Ridge students are so excited that the Library is open again! Students are coming to the library with their classes on Tuesdays (5th grade), Wednesdays (6th grade), and Thursdays (4th grade). I have also begun some exciting reading programs for our students, including:

- Reading Rockets Library Club 41 Students have joined the Reading Rockets Club! In this club, students discuss their favorite books, promote reading, and help in the Library. These students will also help out in November during our Scholastic Book Fair, which we are super excited will return this school year!
- Choose to Read/Reads to Choose: Illinois Childrens' Choice Programs This promotion includes books on the Illinois Bluestem List (grades 3-5) and Rebecca Caudill Young Readers' Book Award List (grades 4-8). This program where students read books nominated by other Illinois students will be open through mid February.
- All-Star Reader Students read at least 5 hours each month, log their reading on a monthly form, and receive a small prize. This program will run through May.

Students have learned how to search for books, put books on hold, and see what books they have checked out using our Destiny Discover app. In October, they will review how to find books using the Dewey Decimal System (yes, we still use that!) and how to use Destiny Discover web services for research.
