Mr. Balderman: Science/SS

SOCIAL STUDIES: This week we finished lesson 4 on European explorers and their artifacts. We then began lesson 5 on different European explorers and their reasons and motives for coming to the New World

MATH: We began Unit 3 this week...fractions!! Your child should now have an understanding that fractions are division problems, and fractions on a number line. Next week we will begin adding and subtracting fractions with like and unlike denominators. Mrs. Worden: ELA

Mr. Mitrovic: ELA/Math

ELA: We have been diving into our Unit 2 in our iLit curriculum. The focus is making connections to the text through life experiences and developing narrative writing with sensory details. We are also working through words with VCV Syllable breaks and how we can read these words correctly.

MATH: We will have our assessment next week on perimeter and area. This involves missing side lengths, rectilinear shapes, and breaking these shapes into manageable rectangles to find the appropriate area.
