Illinois Assessment of Readiness (IAR) and Illinois Science Assessment (ISA) Testing

In the upcoming weeks, New Lenox School District 122 students will participate in online state

testing. During the week of March 7-11, students in third to eighth grade will take the Illinois

Assessment of Readiness (IAR) test. The IAR assessment consists of ELA tests and math tests.

In addition to the IAR, students in fifth and eighth grade will take the Illinois Science Assessment

(ISA) during March 15-24. The ISA consists of three units and will be administered during your child's science class

KINDERGARTEN REGISTRATION

An email went out from our district office regarding registering for Kindergarten. Students who transition from Cherry Hill to Kindergarten do not need to complete that initial registration. You will register as a returning student in spring.

Spencer Trail's website has some great information regarding Kindergarten, feel free to check that information out!

As always, feel free to give us a call with any questions you might have.



As we approach the end of the school year, we are planning for some of our precious preschool friends to move on to kindergarten. When you receive your registration packet for kindergarten, you will find forms for the heath exams that your child needs for kindergarten. I would encourage you to get started on these exams as they can sometimes be overwhelming for your child. Here is what your child will need by the first day of kindergarten:

- 1. A physical examination by a doctor with an up-to-date immunization record is required. Any physical dated after September 2021 will meet the requirements. If your child has had an exam since then, please ask your pediatrician to complete the required form.
- 2. A vision examination is required. This exam must be completed by an eye doctor (optometrist or ophthalmologist). Any vision exam performed after September 2021 will meet the requirement.
- 3. A dental examination is required. This exam must be completed by a dentist. Any dental exam performed after November 2021 will meet the requirement.

 The forms can be submitted to me if you have them completed before school is out. If you do them over the summer, please turn them in at Spencer Trail School. Please note that if your child is attending preschool again next year, they do not need any new medical forms.


