From Ms. Justice:



A Note from the Music Room



How quickly time flies! I have truly enjoyed teaching the students during these past six weeks.

4th grade students have been learning how to read music on the treble clef staff. They really enjoyed creating silly sentences to remember the line notes. The students have been working through four different treble clef practice stations. I am excited for them to start learning how to read music with the recorder next year.

5th grade students listened to the William Tell Overture by Rossini. We talked about the form (the structure of the piece) and learned choreography with cups that matched with each section. I can't believe how long some of the students were able to make their cups spin. We practiced listening for the beat of the music while playing along with the William Tell Overture and In the Hall of the Mountain King by Mussorgsky. We started working on our bucket drumming skills too.

6th grade students learned about time signature. They explored feeling the strong and weak beat of music in 2/4, 4/4 and 3/4 time. The students have also played along to familiar classical pieces with boomwhackers. They have come a long way with their bucket drumming skills in just a short amount of time. They demonstrate the ability to read rhythms and follow along with a bucket drumming score.

Mrs. McCure's musicians have been keeping busy in the music classroom. They have been working on their steady beat skills, learning different songs and poems, playing instruments and, of course, dancing. I loved hearing the students sing along with the song *Happier* by Marshmello. Mrs. Trovato's and Mrs. Dybas' classes have explored music in teams. They have played boomwhackers, xylophones and even learned some choreography with cups, rhythm sticks and tennis balls.

It was a lot of fun guessing the masked singer each week. The students were able to figure out many of them. What a great way to learn about different musical artists.


