We will be Classifying 2-D figures, Using Unit Conversions to Solve Problems, Studying Geometric Figures, Divide Fractions, Create Graphs and Tables.

Students should be reviewing graded assessments, notes and using IXL to practice for the upcoming assessments on Thursday, May 5 and Friday May 13.

SCIENCE: We began our last unit of Science this week on the Earth, Moon, and Stars. We learned about gravity and how Earth isn't the only thing that has gravity.

Just as a reminder students do have notes on every topic in their Math notebook that they can bring home to use for homework assignments. Next week we will be classifying 2-D shapes.
