
NLSD 122 MAY PTO CORNER

Welcome again Oakview families to another short post from Mr. McDivitt's "Notes From The Easel".





4th grade has begun their study of pop art and Andy Warhol. They are creating a printmaking design based on the latest most popular trends. These projects are similar to Andy Warhol's repeated image design.

5th grade is finishing up with their Surrealist Dreamscapes inspired by the work

of Salvador Dali. These dreamscapes take place in a realistic room setting with a bizarre twist, kind of like a strange dream. In this project students learn how to use a vanishing point and draw a room in correct perspective, and also experience the art of magazine or photo collage.



6th grade is making their plaster masks also tied to our multicultural unit of



"Masks around the World" These students are using plaster strips to create a mask of their choice, then they will paint and design them using many different additional materials. These should be fun to look at when they go home.


