

Communication

At Oakview School we value communicating with our parents, but we are not able to give quick responses all of the time. Please note that all of your emails, notes, or phone calls will be answered within 24 hours of our receiving it. During the school day staff are focused on interacting with students and do not always have time to check email during their day. If there is something you need to have communicated to your child we ask that you call the school office so we can make sure your child receives the message. If there is something you need an immediate response to we ask that you call and ask for Ms. Baumann or Mrs. Swiech so that they can hopefully assist you. We appreciate your understanding that our staff wants to be able to dedicate the time during the school day to your children and their evenings to their own families.



DRESS CODE/PERSONAL APPEARANCE

*Research and experience have shown that student conduct, school goals, personal pride, and self- respect are related to personal appearance and mode of dress. Clothing that is disruptive to the educational process will not be tolerated. It is the responsibility of the parents to see that their child is dressed in a manner which reflects good taste, good judgment, safety, and is not disruptive to the educational process. Students are expected to wear clothing in a neat, clean, and well-fitting manner while on school property and/or in attendance at school sponsored activities.

*No student shall wear, or bring to school, any clothing that displays inappropriate language by sign, symbol, or depiction which refers to any drug, tobacco, alcohol, gang, or sexual innuendo.

*Coats, jackets, gloves, sunglasses, hats, and other outerwear may not be worn in the building. Undergarments may not be visible. Students must wear shirts (covering skin in the front, back, and sides under the arms), pants/jeans, or the equivalent, and appropriate footwear at all times. Discrimination based on student hairstyles that are historically associated with race, ethnicity, or hair texture is prohibited.

*Students will be excluded from classes until arrangements for acceptable attire can be made, or appropriate clothing provided. Students will be given reminders/warnings prior to a phone call home.

Nurse's Notes



Dear Oakview Family,

I would like to extend a warm welcome to all students and their parents. I am looking forward to working with you and your children at OAKVIEW! My name is Rebecca Filipiak, former McWilliams, so I am the same nurse!! I would like to share the following important information with you and ask your cooperation in providing the necessary documentation and communication regarding your child in order to ensure his/her health and safety.

<u>HEALTH CONCERNS:</u> Please inform me of any severe allergies, surgeries, accidents or new health problems that occurred during the summer months or which may occur during the school year.

PHYSICAL EXAMS AND IMMUNIZATIONS: In accordance with the New Lenox School District and Illinois State Law, a physical exam and documentation of immunizations are required for all 6th grade students. These are TDAP, MCV4, Completed Heb B series (3), and completed Varicella (2). New students entering must submit an updated immunization record in order to begin school along with a physical exam that was done within one year prior to entrance to school. (unless you were in the district).

MEDICATIONS: NO child is to take or carry PRESCRIPTION OR OVER THE COUNTER MEDICATIONS to school, with the exception of an Epi Pen or an inhaler. A physician's order must accompany all medications to be given during the school day, including over-the-counter drugs. If a student must receive medications in school, both parental permission and a Doctor Order is required. Therefore, a prescription label IS NOT acceptable in lieu of an MD's order. A written order must be obtained. All medication MUST be administered in the nurse's office.

<u>STUDENTS WITH</u>: Asthma, Diabetes, Seizures, and Life Threatening Allergy: Emergency Action Plans must be submitted to the nurse each year.

<u>CONCUSSIONS/INJURIES/SURGERIES:</u> If your child sustains a concussion, an injury or had surgery a doctor's note is required to excuse the student from wellness class and sport activities. The nurses' office along with guidance and teachers will work together if educational accommodations are needed. All doctor notes for concussion/injury/surgery should be given to the nurse by the student in order for her to assess and speak to the student directly on his/her return to school.

CONCUSSIONS/INJURIES/SURGERIES: If your child sustains a concussion, an injury or had surgery a doctor's note is required to excuse the student from wellness class and sport activities. The nurses' office along with guidance and teachers will work together if educational accommodations are needed. All doctor notes for concussion/injury/surgery should be given to the nurse by the student in order for her to assess and speak to the student directly on his/her return to school.

<u>ILLNESS/ABSENCES:</u> Please contact the main office at 815-485-2125 in the morning if your child is to be absent and inform them why he/she will not be attending. If your child has been ill, he/she should be free of a temperature for 24 hours before returning to school without the use of fever reducing medication.

Oakview Music Happenings



Welcome to the 2022-2023 school year! It has been nice seeing all the students in the music room. Let's take a look at what we have started exploring in our first week of school.

4th Grade students started the year with a song called "Going to Kentucky". There learned about the music term 'fermata' which means to sing or play a note longer than usual. They even learned a simple circle dance that accompanied the song. It was good to hear the students' beautiful voices again. 4th graders will compose their first composition using different names. I can't to hear their creations.

5th grade musicians started the year singing a song called "Up the Ladder, Down the Ladder'. Students demonstrated their steady beat skills by using body percussion. They will be learning about the instruments in the band and orchestra. We started exploring the different instruments with a 'Walk the Room' activity. During the first week of September, the students will meet Mrs. Clark (band director) and Ms. Darin (orchestra director). Students will have an opportunity to hear the different instruments they can choose from if they decide to join either ensemble. More information about joining orchestra or band will be sent home after the demonstration.

6th Grade students started the year with the song 'Jump in, Jump Out'. We reviewed rhythms that included the quarter note, eighth notes, and sixteenth notes. The sixth graders will be composing a piece using names. They will then get to perform their composition using classroom instruments.

SI students have started using their singing voices by singing to 'Mr. Blue'. It was so great hearing their beautiful singing voices. We started singing the song 'Engine, Engine Number Nine' and practiced playing different instruments in a steady beat. We also learned a song called "Welcome Back to School' and practiced moving safely around the room.

REACH students also started the year singing the song 'Jump In, Jump Out'. The younger students started using their singing voice by singing to 'Mr. Blue'. They danced around the room with scarves listening for loud music vs. quiet music. They would dance with big movements when the music was loud and small movements when the music was quiet. They did a great job moving safely around the room. The older students started doing research on one of their favorite singers. I am looking forward to learning more about their favorite musicians.

CYBER SECURITY



Dear Oakview Parents,

During the school year we cover specific lessons about internet safety. We go through this curriculum every year to reinforce to all our students the importance of making safe choices while online. We believe a crucial component to keeping our students safe online is parent involvement. To that end, this year our district is providing you with a video series on this important topic.

At Expectation Night, I introduced this video series, Cyberparenting-101: Keeping Our Kids Safe by Det. Richard Wistocki, with his Ted Talk. Here is the link to this <u>Ted Talk</u>, Password: NLSP623!, for those who were unable to attend or who wish to watch it again. Additionally, I will be sending a letter to you each month in our Oakview News newsletter which will include a link to more entries in this series.

Here are some takeaways from this series:

- 1) Do not allow your child to charge their device in their room at night.
- 2) Know all of your child's passwords and usernames.
- 3) Teach your child the P test- If you sent this meme or picture to your parent or your principal, how would they react? Would they laugh and say it is funny or would they be concerned or disappointed?
- 4) Everyone you talk to online should meet these 5 verifications. If you cannot physically verify this information you should not be talking to them online.
 - a) First Name
 - b) Last Name
 - c) Phone Number
 - d) Address
 - e) Where they go to school
- 5) Have a technology talk with your children and let them know they can always come to you if they feel anxious or concerned about an online interaction, and know you will support and help them without judgment or consequences.
- 6) Almost all social media outlets require users to be 13 years old or older. Your child is lying about their age on-line if they are on these platforms.

If you should ever have questions or concerns about your child's activity online and need support, please don't hesitate to reach out to me. I truly hope you will take advantage of this series and join me and our staff in doing all we can to ensure our students' safety.





