

Nurse's Notes:



Here is a good sheet to refer to for students with injuries needing ice or heat. At this age, many kids want ice for various reasons, see which works best!!



What does it do?

Heat therapy opens blood vessels, which increases blood flow, relaxes muscles and helps alleviate pain.

When to use it?

Heat is a great way to help loosen up stiff joints and tight muscles, it is also a good method of pain relief for tension headaches and other chronic conditions. Always wait 48-72 hrs after an injury before considering heat therapy. When in doubt use ice.

Safety Tips

- Treat for no longer than 20 minutes at a time.
- Do not lie on a hot pack to avoid falling asleep and potentially burning yourself.
- Do not use heat if you have no feeling in the affected body part.
- NEVER use heat if there is swelling or bruising.
- Do not apply heat directly to the skin, use a thin towel.
- Do not use heat if you have poor circulation, such as if you have diabetes.
- · Wait 1 hour between heat treatments.

What does it do?

Cold therapy slows down the blood flow to an injury, which reduces swelling, inflammation and pain.

When to use it?

Ice should be used right after an injury or after activity that aggravates a chronic condition. Ice is good for migraine headaches, bumps, sprains and strains that may occur with sports, slips & falls or lifting. Cold therapy is also beneficial for minor burns by applying cold water from the faucet. When in doubt use ICE!

Safety Tips

- Treat for no longer than 20 minutes at a time.
- During treatment, check skin every 5 minutes to make sure there is no damage, such as a freeze burn (skin would become reddened or blistered, just as when burned with heat).
- Do not place ice or packs directly on the skin, use a thin towel.
- Wait 1 hour between cold treatments.

Preschool Screenings

New Lenox School District will be screening children from ages three to five in the areas of motor, cognitive, and speech/language development. Early childhood educators will present "game like" activities to your child which assess various development skills. All preschoolers who reside in our district are eligible to attend free of charge. This is a preschool screening, **not** a kindergarten readiness screening. This year the screenings will be held at Cherry Hill Elementary and Early Childhood Center.

Notes from the Easel

Welcome again Oakview families to another short post from Mr. McDivitt's "Notes From The Easel".



4th grade is working on their sunset/ Silhouette paintings. They first learned how to paint a sunset using water colors, and now they

are adding a silhouette landscape using black paper and sharpie marker.

5th graders are weaving cuffs. They are using rubber

bands as the warp of the weaving so the bracelet can flex to go on and off their wrist. This can be an excellent project to do at home. Maybe you can ask them to teach you how to do one.





Finally, the 6th grade will start a

stained glass influenced chalk drawing. To create the black lines, they will trace the pencil lines with glue which then dries clear. They will learn how to blend chalk to create shading and highlights.

Continue to ask your child what they are doing in art. Students are required to photograph and turn in their work digitally, so you can always ask them to show you what they have done. They will get all of their original art back at the end of the year. Beginning January 24, students and teachers across Illinois will have an opportunity to participate in the eleventh annual statewide Illinois 5Essentials Survey. This survey is designed to generate a detailed picture of the inner workings of your child's school. As a parent, this opportunity will allow you to share your thoughts on the important elements of school effectiveness in a survey about your child's school.

On behalf of the Illinois State Board of Education, the Illinois 5Essentials Survey will be administered online by UChicago Impact at the University of Chicago. The survey gathers data related to five indicators that can predict important student outcomes, including improved attendance and larger test score gains. These five indicators that affect and predict school success are:

- Effective Leaders
- Collaborative Teachers
- Involved Families
- Supportive Environments
- Ambitious Instruction

Prior research in more than 400 schools has shown that schools that were strong on at least three of these "5Essentials" indicators were 10 times more likely to improve student learning gains in math and reading than those that were weak on three or more Essentials.

All teachers and 4th through 8th grade students will be responding to this survey. 5Essentials Reports will be generated for schools if their teachers and/or students meet the response rate threshold of 50 percent. These reports will be sent to schools and districts in May 2023 and will also be included in the State School Report Card.

Additionally, your district has chosen to provide the optional Parent survey supplement. If at least 20 percent of parents complete this survey, a parent supplement report will also be generated. The parent data will not be reported on the State Report Card.

Your participation in the parent portion of the survey will help us understand the conditions at your child's school and guide improvement. Your identity and survey responses will be kept completely confidential and will never be connected to you or your child.

The Illinois 5Essentials Survey for students and teachers will be conducted January 24, 2023 through March 31, 2023. The Parent Survey Supplement will be conducted during that same timeframe.
