# **Oakview Music Happenings**



Welcome to a new school year! I hope everyone enjoyed their summer! Let's take a look at what the students have started doing in music class.

4<sup>th</sup> Grade students started the year reviewing the music concept beat. We did a steady beat challenge where they had to keep the beat going and tell me something about themselves. We answered questions like, What's your favorite color to what's your favorite animal. Many students had a great grasp on keeping the beat steady. We started singing the song '*Hiccup Buttercup*' and we learned a cup game. It was interesting to see if they could keep the beat when the tempo (speed of the music) got faster and faster.

5<sup>th</sup> Grade students also started the year reviewing steady beat and were tasked to complete the same steady beat challenge as 4<sup>th</sup> grade. They did awesome! We also started reviewing the music word rhythm and reviewed rhythm identification by playing a game called 'Secret Chicken'. We also learned a rhythm stick piece to the song '*Yakety Yak*'. This piece combined steady beat practice as well as rhythm practice.

6<sup>th</sup> Grade students practiced identifying music notes and how many beats each note received. We then practiced the steady beat with four different note values; whole note, half note, quarter note and eighth notes. 6<sup>th</sup> grade also started identifying rhythms with the game 'Secret Chicken'. They also starting learning the rhythm stick piece to '*Yakety Yak*'.

SI students started the year singing the song '*If your Happy and You Know It*'. They have been singing the 'Hello song' and 'Goodbye song' so beautifully. We are also dancing with scarves and working on keeping a beat. We started practicing passing a ball around in a circle to a song. We are trying to keep the ball moving without too many stops.

REACH students have started the year using their singing voice by answering questions about themselves. I have learned a lot about them these past couple weeks. We have been reinforcing our beat keeping skills and even practiced our singing skills with the song '*Hiccup Buttercup*'. They really enjoyed freeze dance with Sonic the Hedgehog.

I look forward to a great year of music!

### **Communication**

At Oakview School we value communicating with our parents, but we are not able to give quick responses all of the time. We appreciate your understanding that our staff wants to be able to dedicate the time during the school day to your children and their evenings to their own families.



#### DRESS CODE/PERSONAL APPEARANCE

\*Research and experience have shown that student conduct, school goals, personal pride, and self- respect are related to personal appearance and mode of dress. Clothing that is disruptive to the educational process will not be tolerated. It is the responsibility of the parents to see that their child is dressed in a manner which reflects good taste, good judgment, safety, and is not disruptive to the educational process. Students are expected to wear clothing in a neat, clean, and well-fitting manner while on school property and/or in attendance at school sponsored activities.

\*No student shall wear, or bring to school, any clothing that displays inappropriate language by sign, symbol, or depiction which refers to any drug, tobacco, alcohol, gang, or sexual innuendo.

\*Coats, jackets, gloves, sunglasses, hats, and other outerwear may not be worn in the building. Undergarments may not be visible. Students must wear shirts (covering skin in the front, back, and sides under the arms), pants/jeans, or the equivalent, and appropriate footwear at all times. Discrimination based on student hairstyles that are historically associated with race, ethnicity, or hair texture is prohibited.

\*Students will be excluded from classes until arrangements for acceptable attire can be made, or appropriate clothing provided. Students will be given reminders/warnings prior to a phone call home.

# Nurse's Notes



Dear Oakview Family,

I would like to extend a warm welcome to all students and their parents. I am looking forward to working with you and your children at OAKVIEW! I would like to share the following important information with you and ask your cooperation in providing the necessary documentation and communication regarding your child in order to ensure his/her health and safety.

<u>HEALTH CONCERNS</u>: Please inform me of any severe allergies, surgeries, accidents or new health problems that occurred during the summer months or which may occur during the school year.

<u>PHYSICAL EXAMS AND IMMUNIZATIONS</u>: In accordance with the New Lenox School District and Illinois State Law, *a physical exam* and documentation of immunizations are required for all 6th grade students. These are TDAP, MCV4, Completed Heb B series (3), and completed Varicella (2). New students entering must submit an updated immunization record in order to begin school along with a physical exam that was done within one year prior to entrance to school. (unless you were in the district).

<u>MEDICATIONS:</u> NO child is to take or carry PRESCRIPTION OR OVER THE COUNTER MEDICATIONS to school, with the exception of an Epi Pen or an inhaler. A physician's order must accompany all medications to be given during the school day, including over-the-counter drugs. If a student must receive medications in school, both parental permission and a Doctor Order is required. Therefore, a prescription label IS NOT acceptable in lieu of an MD's order. A written order must be obtained. All medication MUST be administered in the nurse's office.

<u>STUDENTS WITH</u>: Asthma, Diabetes, Seizures, and Life Threatening Allergy: Emergency Action Plans must be submitted to the nurse each year.

<u>CONCUSSIONS/INJURIES/SURGERIES</u>: If your child sustains a concussion, an injury or had surgery a doctor's note is required to excuse the student from wellness class and sport activities. The nurses' office along with guidance and teachers will work together if educational accommodations are needed. All doctor notes for concussion/injury/surgery should be given to the nurse by the student in order for her to assess and speak to the student directly on his/her return to school.

<u>ILLNESS/ABSENCES</u>: Please contact the main office at 815-485-2125 in the morning if your child is to be absent and inform them why he/she will not be attending. If your child has been ill, he/she should be free of a temperature for 24 hours before returning to school without the use of fever reducing medication.

Oster-Oakview Intermediate School 2023-2024

Parents/Guardians,

During our school year, we will practice drills for fire, shelter (weather), and lock down. The purpose of these drills is to prepare our students and staff to respond in the unlikely event of an emergency situation.

The following are the talking points our staff use with our intermediate aged students in regard to a lockdown drill. An announcement is made clearly indicating that this is a drill only and teachers prepare their class prior to the drill.

The first and most important step in any drill is STOP ... LISTEN to your teacher.



Students are trained to:

- Move away from sight
- Maintain silence
- Do not open the door

Adults and staff are trained to:

- Recover students from hallway if possible
- Lock the classroom door
- Turn out the lights
- Move away from sight
- Maintain silence
- Do not open the door
- Prepare to evade or defend

In addition to the information above, teachers discuss Run, Hide, Fight options with students. Student training includes the hide only option. Staff discuss with students what to do if they are in various locations that include run, hide, and fight options (ex: bathroom, hallway, gym, playground).
