# Modern History of the Middle East Day 2

#### Rise of Terrorism in the Middle East

- ™ Since the 1990s the world has seen dramatic growth in Terrorism.
- Terrorism- the use of violence against civilians to achieve a **political** goal.
- A terrorist group called the al-Qaeda was formed by Saudi Arabian named Osama bin Laden.
- ™ Its goal was to remove American & European influences from the Muslim world.

## War on Terrorism Questions:

- 1) What sites were targeted in the attacks on September 11, 2001? Twin Towers and Pentagon
- 2) Why did Bin Laden and other Islamic Extremist have hatred toward the U.S? They objected to troops being in Saudi Arabia, America's support of Israel, & the westernization of their culture

### **Afghanistan**

- Al-Qaeda trained its fighters in Afghanistan & the helped the militant government called the Taliban.
- On September 11, 2001 members of the al-Qaeda attacked sites in the U.S.
- Over 3,000 people were killed in the attacks.
- ™ The U.S. responded by declaring war on Terrorism.

# War in Afghanistan

- In 2001 troops from the U.S. and other countries attacked Afghanistan.
- They defeated the Taliban government and helped set up a democratic government.
- The new government could not control the entire country and Taliban fighters maintain control of some areas.
- ™ The U.S. continued their search for al-Qaeda leaders.
- On May 2, 2011 leader Osama bin Laden was killed by U.S. Special Forces.

# Video Question: Describe the collateral damage of Wars on Civilians such as in Afghanistan.

- -Innocent people die
- -Roads, dams, telephone lines, hospitals and schools are destroyed.
- -Droughts and destroyed crops lead to famines
- -Children die very young and often don't go to school.
- -It's easier for terrorism to take root because of the hardships of daily life.

### **Syria**

- Since, 2000 Syria has been ruled by President Bashar al-Assad.
- His rule has been dictatorial with no democracy.
- Since 2011, the Syrian people have protested him demanding their Human rights.
- ➤ Their revolt has been part of a movement for freedom known as the Arab Spring.

# Civil War in Syria

- Assad's forces struck back against protests, attempting to crush the rebellion with brutal force.
- ™ The U.S. and other countries have tried to work within the United Nations to find a peaceful solution in Syria.
- ™ But China, Russia, and Iran have stood by the Assad regime. They've blocked the U.N. from taking strong action.

### **Results of Conflicts in the Middle East**

- ™ Wars in the Middle East have also forced people to become refugees.
- Refugee- person who flees their home or country because of safety (danger).
- ← As a result of acts of terrorism by extremist or radical Muslim groups discrimination of Muslims around the World has increased.
