General Information

- Located mostly in the Eastern Hemisphere.
- The Equator runs through it.
- Made up of 54 individual nations.
- 3 times the size of the United States.

Basic Facts Video:

- 1. Africa is the 2nd largest continent.
- 2. Home to over 1 billion people.
- 3. Bordered by the Indian and Atlantic oceans.
- 4. Mediterranean sea separates it from Europe and the Red Sea separates it from the Middle East/Asia.
- 5. Arab people make up the Northern 1/3 of the population and Black Africans make up the Southern 2/3.

Landforms

- Africa is one large Plateau.
- Mountains- Highest Mt. Kilimanjaro
- Great Rift Valley- Fault in the Earth's crust.
- Rainforest
- Savanna- large grassland
- Sahara- largest Desert

<u>Rivers</u>

- Nile- Longest in the World (4,160 miles)
- Nile flows into the Mediterranean.
- Other important rivers: Congo, Niger, Zambezi

Geographic Features Video:

- 1. The Sahara Desert is the most dominant physical feature.
- 2. Most of Africa is a great rolling Plateau.
- 3. Highest peaks are Mt. Kenya and Kilamanjaro.
- 4. The Great Rift Valley is where the Earth is pulling itself into two parts.
- 5. Contains the largest lakes- Name one: Victoria, Nyasa or Tanganyika.

Climate

- Mostly tropical- warm year round.
- Northern Climate mirrors the southern because the equator crosses it.
