Effects of the Civil War

- 620,000 lost their lives in the 4 years of fighting.
- Defeat of the South ended slavery.
- Former slaves had no homes or jobs.
- Southern economy was in ruins.
- · Hostility remained between the North and South

Reconstruction

- Refers to the process of readmitting the former confederate states to the Union.
- Lasted 1865-1877.

Lincoln's 10% Plan

- Southerner's had to swear an oath of loyalty to the United States.
- Agree that Slavery was illegal.
- Once 10% of voters made pledges they could form a new government and be readmitted to the union.

Wade-Davis Bill

- Some politicians, mostly Republicans, thought 10% plan wasn't strict enough.
- They wanted states to ban slavery and a majority of men in the state to take the loyalty oath.
- Lincoln refused to sign the bill.

New Amendment

13th – made slavery illegal- ratified on December 18, 1865.

New President

- After Lincoln's assassination, Vice President Andrew Johnson was sworn into office.
- Johnson was a democrat and battled congress over how to treat the South after war.

More Amendments

- 14th (1868)- Granted citizenship to all people born in the U.S. (except Native Americans).
- 15th (1870)- Gave African American men the right to vote.
