1861–1865 Rose from private to major in the Union Army

- 1871 (January 25) Married Ida Saxton
- 1877–1891 U.S. representative from Ohio
- 1892–1896 Governor of Ohio
- 1897–1901 Twenty-fifth President of the United States
- 1901 (September 6) Shot by assassin Leon Czolgosz in Buffalo, New York
- 1901 (September 14) Died of wounds in Buffalo, New York
