This Cuban Rodenas family of four is supported by the booming cigar making industry in the Ybor City section of Tampa, Florida. Both the man and the woman work in the cigar industry, although the woman often works shorter hours so she can care for their two children, both under the age of 14.

The father of the Rodenas family of four works as a hand cigar maker, making \$0.45 per hour working about 46 hours weekly; the average worker receives \$0.29 per hour. Since cigar makers are paid on a piece rate, not hourly, the man makes more than 1,000 cigars each week.

The woman works as a bander, making \$0.18 per hour, or about \$11.50 per week, the average wage for that type of worker in the industry. She frequently works fewer hours, about 40, so that she can tend the children. Cigar workers throughout the country set their own hours and protect that privilege vociferously.

Annual Budget

The study of Cuban cigar makers does not provide a detailed listing of home expenses. A national consumer expenditure from that time period, adjusted for a family of four would be as follows:

- In these pre-air conditioning days of Florida, windows are left open. None of the homes is heated because of the climate of Florida.
