Read Together Daily: Spend 10-15 minutes each day reading with your child and talking about the story.

Practice Kind Words and Actions: Encourage saying “please,” “thank you,” and helping others at home and school.

Create a Consistent Routine: Set regular times for bedtime, meals, and reading to help children feel secure.

Talk About Feelings: Help your child name their feelings and practice calm ways to handle big emotions.

Limit Screen Time: Make time for play, conversation, and creativity without screens each day.

Play and Move Every Day: Enjoy outdoor play, family walks, or movement games to stay healthy and active.

Practice Independence: Let your child try things on their own like putting on coats, cleaning up toys, or packing backpacks.

Share Family Gratitude: At dinner or bedtime, talk about one thing each family member is thankful for.

Stay Connected with School: Check backpacks, newsletters, and school updates regularly and celebrate your child's progress.

Nurse's Corner

Cold, and flu season is officially upon us!

Just a few quick reminders.

- Please keep your child home when they are sick or show any signs of sickness. This really helps to decrease the spread of illness to others.
- Keep your child home if he/she has a fever of 100.0 F or higher. Do not send them back to school until they are fever-free for 24 hours without Ibuprofen or Acetaminophen.
- Please make sure your child is vomit and diarrhea free for 24 hours before sending them to school.
- In the event your child becomes ill at school, please make sure you or your emergency contact is available to pick up your child within 30 minutes.

TERRANOVA TESTING FEBRUARY 3

As part of our ongoing commitment to academic excellence in New Lenox School District 122, the TerraNova NEXT assessment will be administered to all 7th-grade students beginning the week of February 3, 2026. In addition, both the TerraNova NEXT and InView assessments will be administered to all 3rd–6th grade students during the same week.

The TerraNova NEXT is a nationally normed assessment that measures student achievement in reading, language arts, and mathematics. Students in grades three through six will also complete the InView assessment, which measures cognitive abilities such as reasoning, problem-solving, and critical thinking. Results from these assessments are components used to determine eligibility for our Gifted and Accelerated Programs. We encourage all students to give their best effort when completing these assessments.



Preschool Screening

New Lenox School District will be screening children from ages three to five in the areas of motor, cognitive, and speech/language development.

Early childhood educators will present “game like” activities to your child which assess various development skills. All preschoolers who reside in our district are eligible to attend free of charge. This is a preschool screening, not a kindergarten readiness screening. This year the screenings will be held at Cherry Hill Elementary and Early Childhood Center.

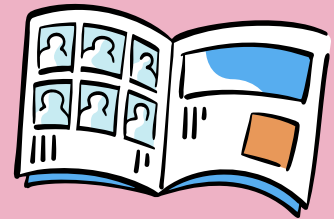
