Diagramming Verbals


(words formed from verb but do not act as verb)

3 Types:


- **Gerunds:** end with *ing* and function like nouns Example: Running is my favorite sport.
- **Participles:** end in *ing, d, t,* or *n* and function like adjectives Example: I hear <u>running</u> water.
- **Infinitives:** are *to* + *verb* and function as nouns, adjectives, or adverbs Example: I love to run.

Diagramming Gerunds

Since they are nouns, they can be the subject, direct objects, object of the preposition, or predicate nominative.




Running marathons is fun.




Diagramming Participles

Place the participle on a curved line below the word that it modifies.




Example: Throwing rocks across the water, my friend smiled.



Diagramming Infinitives


Can be nouns, adjectives, or adverbs
