

List of Conjunctions

Conjunctions join words, phrases, and clauses together.



COORDINATING CONJUNCTIONS

Coordinating conjunctions join words, phrases, or independent clauses of a sentence together. The words, phrases, or independent clauses are of equal importance to the meaning of the sentence. You can remember the coordinating conjunctions with the acronym FANBOYS.

SUBORDINATING CONJUNCTIONS

Subordinating conjunctions join an independent clause and a dependent clause. Dependent clauses cannot stand on their own (they are fragments), so the subordinating conjunction joins them to an independent clause to make a proper sentence. Some common subordinating conjunctions are:

After	Once	When
Although	Since	Whenever
As	Than	Where
Because	That	Wherever
Before	Though	Whether
How	Unless	While
If	Until	



CORRELATIVE CONJUNCTIONS

These conjunctions are used to join similar concepts together, and they always come in pairs. The correlative conjunctions are:

Both... and...
Not only... but also...
Either... or...
Neither... nor...
Whether... or...
