Five Point Activities

Double Doodle

Write your spelling words once. Hold two colored pencils together and write them over again.

Triple Play

Write your spelling words three times each in a different colored marker or colored pencil.

Right and Left

Write your spelling words in two columns using your right hand in one column and left hand in the other.

Handwriting Bests

Write your spelling words in your neatest handwriting. Circle 5 words that you think you wrote the best.

Color Me

Choose two different colors of marker /colored pencils. Write spelling words using one color for vowels and the other for consonants.

ABC Order

Write your spelling words in ABC order in your neatest handwriting. Circle the word that is written the neatest.

SHHHHH!

Write your spelling words down and cross out all of the silent letters in each word.

Computer Fun

Type your spelling words four different times on the computer using a different font each time.

Forward/ Reverse

Write your spelling words forward and reverse. (example: butter→ rettub)

Ten Point Activities

My Friend

Use all of your spelling words to write a letter to a friend that make sense and follows the pattern of a letter.

Collage Spelling

Use a newspaper or magazines to cut out all of your spelling words. Make a collage on construction or notebook paper.

Comic Strip

Write a comic strip with 6 frames using at least 10 of your spelling words.

Silly Sentence

Choose 10 words. Use each letter in one word to create a sentence. example: hungry

Henrietta Used a Nice Green Rowboat Yesterday.

Fifteen Point Activities

Telephone Math

Ladder words
