PreSchool Screening Information:

New Lenox School District will be screening children from ages three to five in the areas of motor, cognitive, and speech/language development. Early childhood educators will present "game like" activities to your child which assess various development skills. All preschoolers who reside in our district are eligible to attend free of charge. This is a

Morning Math Starting Soon:

Morning Math is an additional resource specifically for math help. It runs from 7:30am to 8:15am every week from Tuesday through Friday. New Lenox School District supports the T.E.A.M. Asset Committee in promoting the "Asset of the Month." This month's asset is "Decision Making and Social Awareness," which is defined as "young person knows how to plan ahead and make good choices." To reinforce this asset at home, parents can:

- Give your teenager full responsibility for planning and preparing a family meal once a month.
- Model planning and decision making out loud.
- Discuss issues like drinking/texting while driving, how to say "no" and or how to have a safe "out" plan if they're in an uncomfortable situation.
- Give your teenager increasing responsibility for planning his or her own future.
- Talk children through choices.
- Allow for mistakes. Don't blow-up or rescue a child from a poor choice.
- Explain how "not making a choice" or letting others choose for you are also choices.

FOOD ALLERGY AWARENESS

Foods that most often cause an allergic reaction:



PEANUTS TREE NUTS WHEAT SOY MILK EGGS FISH SHELLFISH

However, other, less common foods can also cause allergic reactions. Reactions can range from mild to deadly.



Anaphylaxis is a serious allergic reaction that is rapid in onset and may cause death. The most common causes of anaphylaxis are food, medication, insect stings, and latex.

Common warning signs and symptoms of an anaphylactic reaction:



- . Complaint of a tingling, itchiness, or metallic taste in the mouth
- Hives
- · Difficulty breathing
- · Swelling and/or itching of the mouth and throat area
- Diarrhea
- Vomiting
- Cramps and stomach pain
- · Paleness (due to a drop in blood pressure)
- · Loss of consciousness

If you see someone showing any of these symptoms, **ACT FAST! Call 911**, mention anaphylaxis, and say you need someone who can administer epinephrine.
