Gifted And Talented Education (GATE)

New Lenox School District 122 believes that each child is unique and has special talents. Teachers provide experiences in an atmosphere in which these talents will be nurtured and new talents will be acquired and encouraged. Teachers will provide options in classroom assignments and learning experiences that will encompass a variety of intelligences, modalities, or learning styles.

Beginning in fourth grade, New Lenox School District 122 has a Gifted and Academically Talented Education program known as GATE. A set criteria is used to determine eligibility into the program. A matrix measures multiple components including student's class performance, cognitive ability, achievement and aptitude.

We recognize many students have remarkable grades (Secure/A's) on their report cards. These scores are part of identifying students for our GATE program. We acknowledge student's academic ability and class performance by factoring GPA/Secures into the eligibility criteria. In addition to grades, achievement scores from the TerraNova, cognitive scores (CSI) from the InView test, and diagnostic scores in grades 6 & 7 are taken into consideration to provide a complete profile of the student. High achieving students who do not qualify for GATE, will be challenged in the general education setting through differentiation strategies implemented by the classroom teachers. Attention: 2nd Grade Parents

As per the State of Illinois, all 2nd Grade students need a current dental exam on file. If you have not turned one in yet, please get your child to the dentist for a checkup and turn the sheet in to me.

Please be sure to wash your child's mask regularly, they can get really gross really fast. Please include a second mask in their backpack in case the first one gets dirty or wet.

If your child/children are exhibiting any of the following signs or symptoms (especially the highlighted ones):

- Fever (100.4 or higher)
- New onset of severe headache
- New cough (no matter how little)
- Sore throat/Scratchy Throat
- Runny/Stuffy Nose
- Vomiting/Diarrhea
- New loss of taste or smell
- Fatigue from unknown cause
- Muscle or body aches from an unknown cause

PLEASE KEEP YOUR CHILD HOME

Please report any positive covid results or any exposures to me ASAP. **If any member of your family (within your household) is testing for covid or you suspect one of them has been exposed or is just feeling sick, please keep all of your children in the district home until you receive the results.**

So far, all of our children that have tested positive have not had a fever and parents thought it was a cold or just allergy symptoms.

There is testing at Martino Junior High on Mondays, Tuesdays and Thursdays each week from 9am-12pm. You do not need an appointment, just pull around to the back of the school and enter by the "Testing" sign.



ASK ABOUT THE CHARACTERS, PLACES, AND EVENTS THAT TOOK PLACE. LISTEN TO YOUR CHILD READ BOOKS FROM SCHOOL. LET THEM KNOW YOU ARE PROUD OF THEIR READING. REREADING FAMILIAR BOOKS IS A GREAT WAY FOR YOUR CHILD TO PRACTICE READING COMFORTABLY AND WITH EXPRESSION. REPETITION ALSO HELPS WITH THEIR FLUENCY! READ TOGETHER EVERY DAY. SPEND TIME TALKING ABOUT STORIES, PICTURES, AND WORDS. THESE TIPS WILL HELP YOUR CHILD BECOME A **LIFELONG READER!**


