A Note from Nurse Cami

National Poison Prevention Week March 19th - March 25th

As a reminder, in January 2007, the Illinois General Assembly passed a law that requires any Illinois residence with fossil fuel-burning appliances, such as gas-powered furnaces or water heaters, or with an attached garage, to install a carbon monoxide alarm within 15 feet of all sleeping areas. Carbon Monoxide is an invisible, tasteless and odorless gas that kills about 200 people in the United States every year. Please keep your family safe from this killer.

The Poison Prevention Week Council provides information about the events associated with National Poison Prevention Week, the steps that you can take to help prevent accidental poisonings and tips for promoting community involvement in poison prevention.

More than 2 million poisonings are reported each year to the 57 poison control centers across the country. More than 90 percent of these poisonings occur in the home. The majority of non-fatal poisonings occur in children younger than six years old. And, poisonings are one of the leading causes of death among adults.

The U.S. Congress established National Poison Prevention Week on September 16, 1961 (P.L. 87-319). Shortly thereafter, the Poison Prevention Week Council was organized to coordinate this annual event and promote poison prevention.

National Poison Prevention Week, the third week in March each year, is a week nationally designated to highlight the dangers of poisonings and how to prevent them. We invite you to review the information on this site and become actively involved in helping ensure the safety of children and adults in your home and your community.

Please remember to pack gym shoes if you are dressing your child in winter boots on gym day.





2023 POSTER THEME: "Safely Rolling to My Destination"

NATIONAL SCHOOL BUS SAFETY WEEK OCTOBER 16-20, 2023

1. WHO MAY ENTER? Any student enrolled must be in a public, parochial or private school.

Division 1 - Grades K-2

Division 3 - Grades 6-8

Division 2 - Grades 3-5

Division 4 - Special Service Students

2. DEADLINE?

April 1, 2023 is the deadline for state competition.

Completed Poster must be 11" X 17" or 12" X 18" only.

3. HOW TO ENTER?

Use a National School Bus Safety Poster Contest 3" X 5" entry blank form, or a reasonable facsimile, with information <u>TYPED</u>

OR PRINTED clearly and signed by the teacher. Securely glue it on the back in the <u>lower left hand corner</u>. The Contact Person Form must be securely glued to the back in the <u>lower right hand corner</u> of the poster.

Designs may be on 12" \times 18" construction paper but should be glued on quality poster illustration board, size 12" \times 18".

4. ORIGINALITY?

POSTER THEME MUST BE ORIGINAL AND CORRECT IN SAFETY CONCEPT.

Drawings must be original, correct in safety concept and the exclusive work of the student entering the contest in idea, design, and execution. Instructor should supervise all work created. Completion of art should be done during the month of March. Poster slogan must harmonize with the theme:

"Safely Rolling to My Destination"

Contestants must illustrate above theme only.

Illustrations should be positive in approach and <u>demonstrate only proper</u> school bus safety behavior.

Illustrations must also <u>accurately portray Illinois law, rules and regulations regarding pupil transportation.</u>

Part of a <u>yellow school bus</u> must be in the poster. <u>Cross arm</u> and <u>stop sign</u> must be in correct position. <u>Stop light colors</u> must be in the correct order. Bus must be on the <u>correct side of the road</u>, not the middle. Bus must <u>not be in or across the crosswalk</u>. Bus driver must have a <u>seat belt</u>.

5. LETTERING?

Only <u>freehand</u> drawn letters may be used in the poster design. Stenciled, pre-printed, manufactured stick-on or press-on letters or tracings may NOT be used. Lettering should be clearly legible, even if used as part of the poster design.

There is no limitation on the use and number of colors. There is no limitation on the type of media -- such as print, crayon, felt pen, etc. -- used on the poster design; however, wood, plastic, glass or metal must not be part of the poster.

Collage materials should not be used. Poster designs may not incorporate any copyrighted characters (i.e., comic and/or television characters), photographs, and magazine or newspaper illustrations.

6. MAIL STATE CONTESTANT ENTRIES TO:

7. JUDGING?

Locally: By administrators, teachers or staff in your schools. Send <u>only 1</u> winning poster for each category.

State: Transportation Directors, Secretary of State or those selected by the I.A.P.T. Board of Directors.

Nationally: Illinois posters selected for final judging will be viewed by the National Board of Judges comprised of prominent individuals in the field of transportation safety. The overall winning poster will be used to promote National School Bus Safety Week in 2023.

Judging criteria for award - winning posters:

- a) Relationship of the poster design to school bus safety practices.
- b) Originality of poster and how the idea is expressed in the poster design.
- c) Artwork and its' execution.
- d) Visual impact of the poster design.

All state/province entries become the property of the NATIONAL ASSOCIATION FOR PUPIL TRANSPORTATION. The right to modify any poster is reserved by the NSBSW Committee, comprised of members of the NAPT, NSTA, NSC, state directors and school bus manufacturers and suppliers.

8. PRIZES?

STATE: Prizes will be awarded for first, second, and third place in each division as follows:

1st Place	\$75
2nd Place	\$35
3rd Place	\$25

NATIONALLY:

1st Place and Overall Winner	\$500
1st Place Winners of remaining 3 divisions	\$250
2nd Place Winners of each 4 divisions	\$100
3rd Place Winners of each 4 divisions	\$ 50
