Thank you to all of our Bentley families that turned in pop tabs for the Ronald McDonald House. We will continue to collect them till the end of the school year.











NOTES FROM OUR NURSE

With the weather turning colder, please dress appropriate for the weather! Here are some winter safety tips.

- Dress in layers young children should wear one more layer of clothing than an adult would wear in the same conditions.
- Don't forget accessories warm boots, gloves, and hats will keep your child comfortable while outside.
- Use sunscreen even in the winter, skin still needs protection from the sun. The sun can reflect off the snow and cause sunburn.
- Wear a helmet children should wear a helmet when skiing, snowboarding, sledding, or playing hockey.
- Nosebleeds if you are prone to winter nosebleeds, a cool air humidifier in the home can help keep noses moist.
- Hydration it is important to stay hydrated because we lose moisture with the dry winter air. Lots of water is the perfect way to stay hydrated.
