Welcome back, Bentley! I am so excited for the new school year!

6th grade families: A physical exam on the State of Illinois Certificate of Child Health Examination form with immunizations and dental exam are due this



year. Please note that one of the required immunizations, meningococcal conjugate, must be given after the child's 11th birthday.

If your child received their physical before their 11th birthday, another appointment will need to be made to obtain the vaccine.

If you turned in a sports physical for your 6th grader, a physical on the State of Illinois form is also needed. A copy of that form can be found here:

PRESCHOOL SCREENING 2024-2025

<u>CLUBS:</u> Students will not be allowed to sign up for more than one club each day. **If your child will not be able to attend please contact our office or send a note with your child.** Attendance is taken in all of our clubs and our office staff will call a parent if a student does not attend.

<u>CHANGES IN ADDRESS/PHONE NUMBERS:</u> Please notify the office as soon as possible of any changes of address, phone numbers, employment or emergency contacts so our records can be kept current. You can also log on to PowerSchool and make changes to your information.

BUS STOP ARM ALERT: Parents, please be aware that buses on the Bentley Campus <u>do</u> use stop arms when loading or unloading students. It is illegal to pass a bus when the stop arm is extended even on our access roads.

<u>BIKE RIDING</u>: Please be advised that students should arrive at school no more than 5 minutes before the entry bell. Please make sure your student locks their bike. <u>SKATEBOARDS AND ROLLER SKATES/BLADES ARE NOT TO BE USED ON SCHOOL PROPERTY. PLEASE CARRY.</u>

<u>ATTENDANCE:</u> Please remember to call our office at (815-485-4451) if your child is absent. Calls should be made by 7:45 AM each day. Be prepared to give your child's name, grade and reason for absence. (Note: Students may not call themselves in as absent.) If we do not receive a call we will contact the New Lenox Police Department to make a wellness check at your residence.

<u>MEDICATION:</u> A reminder from our School Nurse-If your child has to take medication, prescribed or over-the counter, a Medication Authorization form must be submitted. This form is found on our district website and must be signed by the doctor and the parent. Students are not to bring medication to school themselves. It is to be brought into the office by the parent. The medication form can be faxed to the school at 815-485-7599 by your doctor. Thanks!

<u>DROPPING OFF ITEMS:</u> When dropping off items during school hours (lunches, backpacks, homework, library books, glasses, tennis shoes, etc.), please leave them on the table in the building vestibule. There is a slip of paper to fill out and attach to the item. We check the table continually throughout the day.

I am so glad to be with my friends at Bentley School again this year! This is my ninth year at Bentley and Nelson Ridge Schools and my 24th year in the New Lenox School District! I'm looking forward to seeing your children in the library this school year!

Another fact about me is that I am a Field Ambassador for the Field Museum in Chicago. As a Field Ambassador, I am able to attend special educator programs and bring the museum back to my students. This includes bringing small exhibit cases of a variety of museum artifacts to school. Students always enjoy working with these museum items.

Overview of School Year:

This year, we will be having only one book fair in February. But it will be a BIG one! Information will come out in January.

There are several ways students can participate in library activities during the school year:

- Library Lions Club Students who enjoy reading, discussing books, and working in the library are encouraged to join. This club meets every other Tuesday after school starting the end of September.
- Illinois Children's Choice Award Programs Students are encouraged to read books from the Illinois Bluestem Award (for grades 3-5) and Rebecca Caudill Award (grades 4-8) programs. These programs go until the end of February and involve a list of 47 fantastic books. Students who read at least 3 will get the chance to vote on their favorite.
- Star Reader Students fill out a monthly reading log (5 hours total) to earn a small prize.
- Battle of the Books Teams of students read 4 selected books and get quizzed on them to see which team knows them the best. This is always a favorite program and brings a lot of excitement at the end of the school year!

In addition, due to requests from students, I will be sponsoring a **Crochet Club** this school year! This club is for anyone who either wants to learn how to crochet or wants to work on their skills. Permission forms are available in the office.

Summer Reading at the New Lenox Public Library

If your child participated in the summer reading program at the New Lenox Library, please have them bring their certificate to school to participate in a little party in the Library! This will take place during the school day in September. Certificates will be handed back at the party.

Parents/Guardians,

During our school year, we will practice drills for fire, shelter (weather), and lock down. The purpose of these drills is to prepare our students and staff to respond in the unlikely event of an emergency situation.

The following are the talking points our staff use with our intermediate aged students in regard to a lockdown **drill**. An announcement is made clearly indicating that this is a drill only and teachers prepare their class prior to the drill.

The first and most important step in any drill is **STOP... LISTEN to your teacher.**

LOCKDOWN

"Locks, Lights, Out of Sight"

Students are trained to:

- Move away from sight
- Maintain silence
- Do not open the door

Adults and staff are trained to:

- Recover students from hallway if possible
- Lock the classroom door
- Turn out the lights
- Move away from sight
- Maintain silence
- Do not open the door
- Prepare to evade or defend

In addition to the information above, teachers discuss **Run, Hide, Fight** options with students. Student training includes the hide only option. Staff discuss with students what to do if they are in various locations that include run, hide, and fight options (ex: bathroom, hallway, gym, playground).



Your support in discussing these points with your child at home is greatly appreciated.





INFORMATION FOR PARENTS AND **GUARDIANS**

Our school has adopted The "I Love U Guys" Foundation's Standard Response Protocol (SRP). Students and staff will be training, practicing, and drilling the protocol.

COMMON LANGUAGE

The Standard Response Protocol (SRP) is based on an allhazards approach as opposed to individual scenarios. Like the Incident Command System (ICS), SRP utilizes clear common language while allowing for flexibility in protocol.

The premise is simple - there are five specific actions that can be performed during an incident. When communicating these, the action is labeled with a "Term of Art" and is then followed by a "Directive." Execution of the action is performed by active participants, including students, staff, teachers and first responders. The SRP is based on the following actions: Hold, Secure, Lockdown, Evacuate, and Shelter.

"In Your Classroom or Area"

Students are trained to:

- Clear the hallways and remain in their area or room until the "All Clear" is announced
- Do business as usual

Adults and staff are trained to:

- Close and lock the door
- Account for students and adults
- Do business as usual

SECURE

"Get Inside, Lock outside doors"

Students are trained to:

- Return to inside of building
- Do business as usual

Adults and staff are trained to:

- Bring everyone indoors
- Lock the outside doors
- Increase situational awareness
- Account for students and adults
- Do business as usual





LOCKDOWN

"Locks, Lights, Out of Sight"

Students are trained to:

- Move away from sight
- Maintain silence
- Do not open the door

Adults and staff are trained to:

- · Recover students from hallway if possible
- Lock the classroom door
- Turn out the lights
- Move away from sight
- Maintain silence
- Do not open the door
- Prepare to evade or defend

"To a Location"

Students are trained to:

- Leave stuff behind if required to
- If possible, bring their phone
- Follow instructions

Adults and staff are trained to:

- Bring roll sheet and Go Bag (unless instructed not to bring anything with them, dependent on reason for evacuation.)
- Lead students to Evacuation location
- Account for students and adults
- Report injuries or problems using Red Card/Green Card method.

SHELTER

"State Hazard and Safety Strategy"

Hazards might include:

- Tornado
- Hazmat
- Earthquake
- Tsunami

Safety Strategies might include:

- Evacuate to shelter area
- Seal the room
- Drop, cover and hold
- Get to high ground

Dear Parents,

During the school year we cover specific lessons about internet safety. We go through this curriculum every year to reinforce to all our students the importance of making safe choices while online. We believe a crucial component to keeping our students safe online is parent involvement. To that end, this year our district is providing you with a video series on this important topic.

Cyberparenting-101: Keeping Our Kids Safe by Det. Richard Wistocki, is an excellent resource for parents. Here is the link to this <u>Ted Talk</u>, Password: NLSP623!.

I will be sending information to you each month in our Bentley newsletter which will include a link to more entries in this series.

Here are some takeaways from this series:

- 1) Do not allow your child to charge their device in their room at night.
- 2) Know all of your child's passwords and usernames.
- 3) Teach your child the P test- If you sent this meme or picture to your parent or your principal, how would they react? Would they laugh and say it is funny or would they be concerned or disappointed?
- 4) Everyone you talk to online should meet these 5 verifications. If you cannot physically verify this information you should not be talking to them online.
 - a) First Name
 - b) Last Name
 - c) Phone Number
 - d) Address
 - e) Where they go to school
- 5) Have a technology talk with your children and let them know they can always come to you if they feel anxious or concerned about an online interaction, and know you will support and help them without judgment or consequences.
- 6) Almost all social media outlets require users to be 13 years old or older. Your child is not being truthful about their age on-line if they are on these platforms.



With a short-term approval, paraprofessionals need only to be 19 years of age with a high school diploma (or equivalent), or higher. This approval is available now until June 30, 2025.
