Illinois Assessment of Readiness (IAR) and Illinois Science Assessment (ISA) Testing

Please read the info below if you are interested in applying for NJHS this year:

Attention all students interested in joining NJHS. In late January, students with a cumulative grade point average of 3.9 or higher will be added to the NJHS Application Google Classroom. Once in the classroom, students will have access to the NJHS digital application as well as specific information that will outline what achievements are needed to be considered for induction into Liberty Junior High's chapter of NJHS.

Some of the basic requirements are as follows. If you are interested in applying for NJHS later in the school year, please take note of the requirements to make sure you are working to maintain the minimum requirements for membership.

- 1. Maintain a minimum cumulative G.P.A of a 4.0 at the end of the second trimester.
- 2. Participate in at least three clubs or activities, one of which must be a Liberty club or activity.
- 3. Obtain at least five hours of service to either school or community.
- 4. Maintain a positive discipline record.
 - If an office referral OR four classroom steps are on your record, you will not be eligible for NJHS.
- 5. Demonstrate strong character in the classroom.
 - If you receive four or more late and/or missing assignments, you will not be eligible for NJHS.



Important Health Information From the Nurse For Parents to Know

- Doctor's Appointments: Please turn in doctors notes for any absences related to doctors appointments. All documents can be dropped off at the main office or emailed to jkerzman@nlsd122.org.
- Stay home if sick with fever over 100 degrees until fever free for 24 hours.
- Please update your emergency contacts.
- Doctors orders must be turned in for ANY medication to be taken or given by the school nurse during school hours. This includes over-the-counter medications such as Advil, Tylenol, etc. as well as prescription medications such as Epipen and inhalers.
- PE Excuses: Any excusals lasting longer than two days must be documented with a doctor's note that includes the length of excusal listed.
- Please contact the school nurse at 815-462-7806 for prolonged illness lasting longer than three consecutive school days or that have to do with either injuries or concussions.
 The nurse can assist in planning for the student's return to school.

Beginning February 18th, students and teachers across Illinois will have an opportunity to participate in the eleventh annual statewide Illinois 5Essentials Survey. This survey is designed to generate a detailed picture of the inner workings of your child's school. As a parent, this opportunity will allow you to share your thoughts on the important elements of school effectiveness in a survey about your child's school.

On behalf of the Illinois State Board of Education, the Illinois 5Essentials Survey will be administered online by UChicago Impact at the University of Chicago. The survey gathers data related to five indicators that can predict important student outcomes, including improved attendance and larger test score gains. These five indicators that affect and predict school success are:

- Effective Leaders
- Collaborative Teachers
- Involved Families
- Supportive Environments
- Ambitious Instruction

Prior research in more than 400 schools has shown that schools that were strong on at least three of these "5Essentials" indicators were 10 times more likely to improve student learning gains in math and reading than those that were weak on three or more Essentials.

All teachers and 4th through 8th grade students will be responding to this survey. 5Essentials Reports will be generated for schools if their teachers and/or students meet the response rate threshold of 50 percent. These reports will be sent to schools and districts in May 2025 and will also be included in the State School Report Card.

Additionally, your district has chosen to provide the optional Parent survey supplement. If at least 20 percent of parents complete this survey, a parent supplement report will also be generated. The parent data will not be reported on the State Report Card.

Your participation in the parent portion of the survey will help us understand the conditions at your child's school and guide improvement. Your identity and survey responses will be kept completely confidential and will never be connected to you or your child.

The Illinois 5Essentials Survey for students and teachers will be conducted February 18, 2025 through March 28, 2025. The Parent Survey Supplement will be conducted during that same timeframe. FOOD ALLERGY AWARENESS

Foods that most often cause an allergic reaction:



PEANUTS TREE NUTS WHEAT SOY MILK EGGS FISH SHELLFISH

However, other, less common foods can also cause allergic reactions. Reactions can range from mild to deadly.



Anaphylaxis is a serious allergic reaction that is rapid in onset and may cause death. The most common causes of anaphylaxis are food, medication, insect stings, and latex.

Common warning signs and symptoms of an anaphylactic reaction:



- · Complaint of a tingling, itchiness, or metallic taste in the mouth
- Hives
- Difficulty breathing
- · Swelling and/or itching of the mouth and throat area
- Diarrhea
- Vomiting
- Cramps and stomach pain
- Paleness (due to a drop in blood pressure)
- · Loss of consciousness

If you see someone showing any of these symptoms, **ACT FAST! Call 911**, mention anaphylaxis, and say you need someone who can administer epinephrine.
