- When do students receive their schedules?
 - · Schedules are typically made available in PowerSchool the second week in August.
- Do students have lockers?
 - · Yes, students will have two different lockers: Hallway and P.E. Lockers
 - School provides all locks.
 - · Hallway locker will be located near your study hall classroom.
 - Hallway locker assignments and combinations will be on your child's schedule in August.
 - P.E. locker and a combination will be provided by P.E. teacher after the start of the school year.

• How does P.E. work?

- Students change into P.E. uniforms for class each day.
- P.E. uniforms can be purchased at the Walk-Thru in August or though the P.E. teacher after the start of the year.
- Students DO NOT shower at the end of P.E. class.

What technology do junior high students use?

- We use pretty much the same as what you use in 6th grade:
 - iPads w/ Keyboard Cases
 - Google Classroom
 - Phones? They are to be put away and not used during the school day.

Can students find their classrooms and move in to their lockers before school starts in the fall?

· We will have a Walk-Thru Event in August.

How do I keep updated on my child's progress?

- Parents/Guardians can follow grades via PowerSchool
- Students and parents/guardians get separate passwords
- Electronic mid-terms and report cards each trimester

- Do you offer Accelerated (GATE) Classes?
 - · We offer Accelerated ELA and Math.
- How do students qualify for Accelerated Classes?
 - · There are separate qualifications for each class.
 - We use the District's Matrix Rubric to determine placement.
 - The Matrix Rubric utilizes a combination of assessment scores and a student's grade point average.
- When will students/parents/guardians be notified of Accelerated placements?
 - Letters are anticipated to be mailed out to those that qualify in May.

 - · Complete your daily assignments on time.
 - Ask for help when needed.
 - · Stay as organized as possible (folders and locker).
 - Use your assignment notebook (due dates/homework).

Welcome to Liberty Junior High School! Today, students of our Class of 2027 had the opportunity to visit Liberty to learn about their upcoming transition to junior high school. We spoke with the students about how our schedule works, the classes that will be offered, and the extra-curricular activities we provide. They also took a tour of the building and had the opportunity to ask questions to a couple of our current eighth grade students.

One very important topic we covered was that of the "encore" class. Students are able to select this class based on what best fits their interests and skill set. Each student was provided an *Encore Course Description Sheet* that contains the list of the encore classes that are available for next year along with a short description of each. Please review this information to determine which course is most appropriate for your child. Encore class selections will be made in PowerSchool *between Monday*, *April 7*, *and Friday*, *April 25*. Directions on how to complete the process will be shared prior to April 7.

In regards to Introduction to Spanish, this course provides an academically rigorous curriculum and a strong work ethic is necessary to be successful. Students' standardized test scores will be considered as part of the placement process for Introduction to Spanish. As space is limited in this class, there is a likelihood that not all requests will be able to be granted. In this event, students that are not able to be placed in Introduction to Spanish will be placed in cycle class.

FOR THE 2025 - 2026 SCHOOL YEAR LIBERTY JUNIOR HIGH

All junior high students are assigned an "encore" class each year. Please see the list of encore class options below, then make your selections in the PowerSchool Parent Portal between Monday, April 7 and Friday, April 25. The course options for this year are:

CYCLE (available to both 7th and 8th grade students):

Cycle classes provide an introduction to a variety of topics and cover required state standards. The cycle classes for both 7^{th} and 8^{th} graders next year are:

Music:

This class will give students a graduated knowledge and appreciation of music, which engages the
mind to read, compose, perform, and critique. Through active participation in a variety of
individual and ensemble experiences using traditional instruments and technology, students will
strive for musical excellence and to become life-long participants, intelligent consumers, and
active patrons and advocates for the arts.

Art

Students in this class will have fun engaging in hands-on learning experiences using a variety of
media. Students will create projects large and small while practicing skills including but not
limited to: drawing, painting, photography, printmaking, mixed media, pottery, and sculpture.
There will be something to fit all students' interests with a focus on helping them discover the joy
of learning as they follow their passion through creativity.

Applied Digital Skills (A.D.S.):

Digital learners participate in coding, robotics, digital design, and multimedia creation. Students
will enhance their communication skills, digital citizenship, and practical technology skills using
real-life applications. Students will also participate in career exploration activities in this class.

BAND (available to both 7th and 8th grade students):

The Junior High Band program consists of many different musical opportunities for all students including; concert band, jazz band, marching band, woodwind choir, brass choir, and percussion ensemble. These groups perform at numerous concerts, contests, and parades and have achieved a high level of success through each member's dedication and diligent hard work. Members of this group are eligible to audition for the ILMEA Honors Ensemble and participate in IGSMA Solo and Ensemble Contest. In addition, students from the junior high band program are eligible to participate in the Jazz Band, an extra-curricular band ensemble open to all band members and orchestra bass players. One or two field trips are typically planned to celebrate the band's successes. All members must have prior band experience to participate. Exceptions are at the discretion of the teacher. A \$60 fee will be required.

ORCHESTRA (available to both 7th and 8th grade students):

The Junior High Orchestra program offers students the opportunity to perform at a variety of concerts and community events throughout the school year on an orchestral instrument (violin, viola, cello, string bass). Members of this group are eligible to audition for the ILMEA Honors Ensemble and participate in IGSMA solo and ensemble contest. In addition, students from the junior high orchestra program are eligible to participate in the Allegro Ensemble, an alternative strings group open to all orchestra members, and Jazz Band (bass players only). The group performs at least three school concerts a year. All members are expected to have prior orchestra experience to participate. Exceptions are at the discretion of the teacher. A \$60 fee will be required.
