

What is a Concussion?

A concussion is a type of traumatic brain injury caused by a bump, blow, or jolt to the head or by a hit to the body that causes the head and brain to move rapidly back and forth. This sudden movement can cause the brain to bounce around or twist in the skull, creating chemical changes in the brain and sometimes stretching and damaging brain cells (Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, 2022).

All concussions are serious, especially for the developing brain. It is important to recognize and respond quickly when a concussion first occurs to aid in recovery and prevent further injury. Please seek medical attention immediately if a concussion is suspected. Please report any head injury or concussion diagnosis to the school nurse immediately.

Possible signs and symptoms

Signs (things observed by you)

- · Seems confused
- · Answers questions slowly
- Repeats questions
- Can't remember events before or after the hit, bump, or fall
- Loses consciousness (even for a moment)
- Has behavior or personality changes

Symptoms (things reported by the student or a witness to the injury)



Thinking/Remembering:

- Trouble thinking clearly
- Trouble concentrating
- Problems with short- or long-term memory
- · Feeling slowed down
- · Feeling foggy or groggy



Emotional:

- Irritable
- Sad
- · More emotional than usual
- Nervous or anxious



Physical:

- Headache
- Nausea or vomiting
- · Dizziness or balance problems
- · Feeling tired
- Vision problems
- · Bothered by light or noise
- Numbness or tingling
- · Does not "feel right"



- Sleeps less than usual
- Sleeps more than usual
- Trouble falling asleep

INFORMATION FOR PARENTS AND GUARDIANS

Our school has adopted The "I Love U Guys" Foundation's Standard Response Protocol (SRP). Students and staff will be training, practicing, and drilling the protocol.

COMMON LANGUAGE

The Standard Response Protocol (SRP) is based on an all-hazards approach as opposed to individual scenarios. Like the Incident Command System (ICS), SRP utilizes clear common language while allowing for flexibility in protocol.

The premise is simple - there are five specific actions that can be performed during an incident. When communicating these, the action is labeled with a "Term of Art" and is then followed by a "Directive." Execution of the action is performed by active participants, including students, staff, teachers and first responders. The SRP is based on the following actions: Hold, Secure, Lockdown, Evacuate, and Shelter.

HOLD

"In Your Classroom or Area"

Students are trained to:

- Clear the hallways and remain in their area or room until the "All Clear" is announced
- Do business as usual

Adults and staff are trained to:

- Close and lock the door
- Account for students and adults
- Do business as usual

SECURE

"Get Inside Lock outside doors"

Students are trained to:

- Return to inside of building
- Do business as usual

Adults and staff are trained to:

- Bring everyone indoors
- Lock the outside doors
- Increase situational awareness
- Account for students and adults
- Do business as usual



"Locks, Lights, Out of Sight" Students are trained to:

LOCKDOWN

- Move away from sight
- Maintain silence
- Do not open the door

Adults and staff are trained to:

- Recover students from hallway if possible
- Lock the classroom door
- Turn out the lights
- Move away from sight
- Maintain silence
- Do not open the door
- Prepare to evade or defend

EVACUATE

"To a Location"

Students are trained to:

- Leave stuff behind if required to
- If possible, bring their phone
- Follow instructions

Adults and staff are trained to:

- Bring roll sheet and Go Bag (unless instructed not to bring anything with them, dependent on reason for evacuation.)
- Lead students to Evacuation location
- Account for students and adults
- Report injuries or problems using Red Card/Green Card method.

"State Hazard and Safety Strategy"



- Tornado
- Hazmat

- Compare and contrast a fictional portrayal of a time, place, or character and a historical account of the same period as a means of understanding how authors of fiction use or alter history.






Click on the "Create My Account" link at the bottom.

Scheduling Meetings


When you choose to Add/Edit meetings for a conference from the Agenda view, you will see the Schedule View.

In order to begin you must first add teachers to the page.

All of the teachers that are available to you will be visible when you open the "Teacher drawer" from the left side of the page by clicking the "Teachers" button.



All teachers with conference times will be visible in that drawer.



As you select teachers, they will appear in a matrix view on the page behind the drawer. Once you close the drawer you will be able to make appointments for all of the teachers you selected.

You can open the teacher drawer and add or remove teachers from the page at any time.

After you close the drawer you will see the schedules for the teachers you have selected.



You can only see one day at a time. The selected day is visible at the top. If there is more than one day for the In Person conference, then you will see multiple options for the day at the top.

Meetings are saved in real time when you select them.

As you select meeting times, your agenda will grow. The Agenda Drawer slides out from the right side of the display and will contain all of your meetings for the conference you are viewing.



You can cancel a meeting from here or by unselecting the time itself.

Confirm and Email

After you finish reviewing your meetings, you should press the "Confirm this agenda" button to receive an email confirmation of your selections.

If you do not click that button, you will not receive an email confirmation. However, your meetings are still saved.
