What is an Honor Society?

Membership in the Liberty or Alex M. Martino chapters of the National Junior Honor Society (NJHS) is the highest honor given to a middle school student and carries with it a distinction recognized nationwide. The organization seeks to create an enthusiasm for superior scholarship, develop citizenship, promote leadership, and instill exemplary qualities of character.

NJHS is more than just an honor roll. The Honor Society chapter establishes rules for membership that are based upon a student's outstanding performance in the areas of scholarship, service, leadership, citizenship, and character. These criteria for selection form the foundation upon which the organization and its activities are built.

Scholarship: Students who have a cumulative grade point average of **4**.00 or higher, following the second trimester of the current school year, have met the minimum requirement for scholarship.

Leadership: Student leaders are those who are resourceful, good problem solvers, idea-contributors, dependable, and persons who exemplify positive attitudes about life. Leadership experiences can be drawn from mature participation and responsibility gained through involvement with such activities as athletics, scouting, community organizations, and school clubs.

Service: This quality is defined through the voluntary contributions made by a student to the school or community, done without compensation and with a positive, courteous, and enthusiastic spirit.

Citizenship: The student who demonstrates citizenship understands the importance of civic involvement and has a high regard for freedom, justice, and democracy.

Character: The student of good character upholds principles of morality and ethics, is cooperative, demonstrates high standards of honesty and reliability, shows courtesy, concern, and respect for others, and generally maintains a positive lifestyle.

When do I become eligible?

Seventh grade students who are selected for membership in NJHS are inducted during the third trimester; they will serve as active NJHS members for their eighth grade year. Eighth grade students who are selected for membership in NJHS may be inducted as honorary NJHS members during the third trimester. Membership in NJHS is a junior high honor; it does not transfer to the National Honor Society (NHS) at the secondary level.

What requirements do I have to meet in order to be considered for membership in the National Junior Honor Society? Adjusted for 2021–22 due to the COVID-19 Pandemic.

- Maintain a cumulative GPA of 4.00 or higher.
- Be a leader participate in community/school activities, athletics, or school clubs. The minimum requirement to be considered for membership in NJHS is active participation in at least one activity. (Active participation is defined as attendance/involvement in at least 80% of the meetings, practices, or games related to the activity. Activities can be either school offered sports/clubs/activities or non-school related activities. For this special COVID-19 Application Packet, students may include activities from this school year as well as last school year. In addition, this year, parents MAY sign off on clubs/activities to indicate participation. Please consult the NJHS advisor with any questions.
- Provide service to your school/community. The minimum requirement to be considered for membership in NJHS is having provided at least five hours of service to either the school or community. Complete the NJHS service hours log with service hours you have obtained this school year or last school year. If possible, please obtain the signature of the supervisor/sponsor for the activity. If that is not possible, due to the COVID-19 pandemic, parents MAY sign off on obtained service hours.
- Demonstrate positive citizenship. School administrators and the NJHS Council will consider your discipline record as evidence of your citizenship. For citizenship, students receiving an office referral or four or more classroom steps, will not be eligible for NJHS.
- Demonstrate strong character in the classroom/school environment. For character, students receiving four or more late and/or missing assignments will not be eligible for NJHS.

What process do I follow to be considered for membership in NJHS?

After receiving your second trimester report card showing you have earned a cumulative GPA of 4.00 or higher, please complete an evidence packet for the faculty council to consider in order to determine acceptance to NJHS. The evidence packets are available in the school office, school website or from the NJHS faculty advisor. PLEASE be aware that evidence packets are due **no later than** Friday, March 11, 2022, at 3:00 p.m. late packets will NOT be considered.

How is membership for NJHS determined?

Students who earn eleven or more points on the NJHS Evaluation Rubric and have been recommended by the staff council will be considered for induction as members of NJHS. The NJHS advisor is not a member of the faculty council; the advisor acts as liaison between the student and the faculty council.

How and when am I notified that I have been selected to be inducted as a member of NJHS?

A congratulatory letter along with an invitation for your family to attend the Induction Ceremony will be sent home within two weeks of the final due date for the evidence packet. Specific reasons may be given; however, the NJHS sponsor shall provide recommendations for future NJHS consideration.

What happens after I am selected to be in NJHS?

You are expected to attend an Induction Ceremony where you will commit to the ideals of the National Junior Honor Society and accept the responsibility associated with membership. You will receive a certificate commemorating this special honor.

How and when am I notified that I have not been selected to be inducted as a member of NJHS?

You will receive a letter stating you were not selected for membership in NJHS within two weeks of the final due date for the evidence packet.

Is there an appeal process if I am not selected to be inducted as a member of NJHS?

Students who wish to appeal the decision of the faculty council may submit an appeal <u>in writing</u> to the principal within one week of being notified of non-selection. (Students are required to submit the appeal, not the parents) Per the NJHS Constitution, Section 4.4.2, the principal may ask the faculty council to reconvene to review the situation. Decisions jointly made by the faculty council and principal are then final.

What if I do not maintain the ideals of NJHS after induction?

It is expected that active members of NJHS continually strive for excellence in scholarship, leadership, service, citizenship, and character. If the ideals within any of these categories fall below what is expected, the member will be placed on a probationary status. Parents/Guardians will receive written notification when a student is placed on probationary status.

- (G.P.A) If your G.P.A falls below 4.0, you must bring your grades up by the timeline determined in your probation letter otherwise you would be dismissed.
- (Citizenship/Character) If you receive an office referral OR more than two steps OR more than two late/missing assignments, you will be on probation status. Any further discretions, you would be dismissed.

Why is membership in the NJHS considered such a great honor?

Schools throughout the country participate in the National Junior Honor Society. If inducted, you are a member of a select group of young people who are considered the best and brightest in your school. You have the admiration of friends and family and should take great pride in this outstanding accomplishment.
